



Small Business Certifications for Government and Private Sector Contracts

Why Certify?

- Access to Contracts: The federal government sets aside contracts to be awarded to business with certain verified certifications.
- ➤ **Ability to Form Joint Ventures**: Once certified, you can often join other business within your certification to compete for certain contracts.
- Additional Management and Technical Assistance: Many certification programs offer management and technical assistance to help businesses grow and succeed.

Type of Certifications

8(a) Small Business Certification

- Program Benefits
 - Efficiently compete and receive certain set aside government contracts
 - Receive one-on-one business development assistance for length of the certification
 - Pursue opportunity for mentorship from experienced firms
 - Connect with procurement and compliance experts
 - Pursue joint ventures with established businesses to increase capacity
 - Qualify to receive federal surplus property
 - Receive free training from SBA's 7(j) Management and Technical Assistance Program
- Program Qualifications
 - 51% controlled by US citizens who are socially or economically disadvantaged
 - Owners must
 - ♦ Manage day to day operations
 - Make long term decisions
 - ♦ Have personal net worth less than \$850,000
 - ♦ Have adjusted gross income of \$400,000 or less
 - ♦ Assets totaling \$6.5 million or less
 - ♦ Demonstrate good character
 - Demonstrate the potential for success (such as being in business for two years
- Certification Application
 - Use the SBA's eligibility tool to get a preliminary assessment of program fit.
 - Complete the application on the Small Business Administration website
 - If approved, certification lasts for maximum of nine years
 - Subject to annual reviews to maintain standing in the program





> HUBZone Business Certification (Historically Underutilized Business Zone)

- Program Benefits
 - Efficiently compete for the program's set-aside contracts
 - Get a ten percent price evaluation preference in full and open contract competitions
 - Ability to still compete for contracts under other qualifying programs
- Program Qualifications
 - Be a small business according to SBA size standards
 - 51% owned and controlled by:
 - ♦ US citizens
 - ♦ A Community Development Corporation
 - ♦ An agriculture cooperative
 - ♦ An Alaska Native corporation
 - ♦ A Native Hawaiian organization, or
 - ♦ A Native American tribe
 - Principal office must be located in a HUBZone*
 - Have at least 35% of its employees living in a HUBZone*
- Certification Application
 - Make sure you have a SAM.gov account (System for Award Management)
 - Register for an SBA Connect account and request access to the HUBZone portal (<u>Instructional video</u>)
 - Login to SBA Connect and select HUBZone before completing the prompts
 - Check email (including SPAM folder) for instructions to complete within 2 business days
 - Submit all requested documents within 3 business days
 - Submit any requested follow up documentation within 5 business days
 - Verify that status was updated in DSBS (Dynamic Small Business Search Database) and SAM
- Maintaining Certification
 - Must recertify once per year
 - No limit to length of time for participation
 - Program examination required every three years
 - Notification to SBA required if
 - ♦ Business is involved in an acquisition or merger
 - ♦ Employee residency in HUBZone drops below 20% while performing on a HUBZone contract
 - SBA may visit unannounced and conduct examinations for accuracy verification

^{*}Note: The HUBZone map is changing on July 1, 2023.





Women-Owned Small Business (WOSB) and Economically Disadvantaged Women-Owned Small Business (EDWOSB)

- Program Benefits
 - Efficiently compete for the program's set-aside contracts
 - Contracts are for goods and services in specific industries (list of eligible industries)
 - Some contracts are restricted to EDWOSBs
 - Ability to compete for contracts in other qualifying categories (including 8(a) and HUBZone)
- Program Qualifications
 - Be a small business according to the SBA size standards
 - 51% owned and controlled by women who are US citizens
 - Have women manage day-to-day operations and also make long-term decisions
 - Further qualifications for EDWOSB include being owned and controlled by one or more women who
 - ♦ Each have a personal net worth less than \$850K
 - Each have \$450K or less in adjusted gross income averaged over the last three years
 - ♦ Each have \$6.5 million or less in personal assets
- Certification Application
 - Use the eligibility tool to get a preliminary assessment of qualification
 - Complete the application process on the SBA's WOSB website
- Maintaining Certification
 - Annual attestation to meeting program requirements must be submitted within 30 days of anniversary date of certification (currently in abeyance)
 - Program examination is required every three years
 - Must update SAM.gov profile annually (or prior to end of fifth year for contracts longer than 5 years)
- Third Party Certifications (TPC) recognized by the SBA*
 - El Paso Hispanic Chamber of Commerce
 - National Women Business Owners Corporation
 - U.S. Women's Chamber of Commerce
 - Women's Business Enterprise National Council

*NOTE: Once approved through one of these TPCs, you will still need to upload proof of citizenship and TPC-certified documentation to the SBA's WOSB site before bidding on contracts.





Minority Business Enterprise Certification (MBE)

- Program Benefits
 - Exposure to business opportunities through local, regional and national referrals
 - Listings in the National Minority Supplier Development Council (MSDC) supplier database
 - Invitations to private networking and corporate match making events
 - Opportunities to compete for prestigious local, regional and national supplier awards
 - Access to educational training
 - Opportunity to build relationships and find opportunities with other MBEs
- Program Qualifications
 - Be a functioning for profit enterprise physically located in the U.S. or its territories
 - 51% independently owned, managed, and controlled by one or more minority group members
 - ♦ Asian-Indian: US citizen with origins in India, Pakistan and Bangladesh
 - Asian-Pacific: US citizen with origins in Japan, China, Indonesia, Malaysia, Taiwan, Korea, Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, the Philippines, Thailand, Samoa, Guam, the US Trust Territories of the Pacific, or Northern Marianas
 - ♦ Black: US Citizen who is of African descent (excluding Northern Africa)
 - ♦ Hispanic: US citizen of true-born Hispanic heritage from the regions of Mexico, Central America, South America, The Caribbean Basin, Brazil (Afro-Brazilian, indigenous/Indian only)
 - ♦ Native American: Documented members of a North American tribe, band or otherwise organized group of American Indian, Eskimo, Aleut or Native Hawaiian people
 - Demonstrate the capability to perform a line of business
 - Provide a commercially useful business function
- Certification Application
 - Go to the Carolinas-Virginia Minority Supplier Development Council (CVMSDC) website
 - Review certification criteria to ensure qualification
 - Gather required documentation and complete the application
 - A desk audit and site visit will be completed before approval process begins
 - Written notification is sent withing one week
- Maintaining Certification
 - Certification must be renewed annually
 - Complete recertification application and required documents (instructions)

NOTE: It is the responsibility of the MBE to ensure that all paperwork for recertification is completed annually.





> B Corp Certification

- Program Benefits
 - Build trust with consumers, communities, and suppliers
 - Attract and retain employees
 - Draw mission-aligned investors
- Program Qualifications
 - Demonstrate high social and environmental performance by
 - ◆ Achieving a B Impact Assessment score of 80% or higher
 - ♦ Passing the B Corp Risk Review
 - Make a legal commitment by
 - Changing your legal structure to be accountable to all stakeholders, not just shareholders
 - Achieve benefit corporation status (if available for your location)
 - Exhibit transparency by
 - Allowing information about performance against standards to be publicly available on profile
- Certification Application
 - Certification is dependent on revenue and company size among other factors (Pathway to Certification)
 - Register for the <u>B Impact Assessment</u>
 - Use the Legal Requirement Tool to determine governance structure
 - Complete the Risk Review
 - Gather appropriate documentation and take the B Impact Assessment
 - Establish a company profile and start the Disclosure Questionnaire
 - Go through the Evaluation and Verification process
- Maintaining Certification
 - Recertification occurs
 - Every three years,
 - ♦ After a change of control (of company ownership), or
 - ♦ After an Initial Public Offering
 - Update B Impact Assessment
 - Verify updated B Impact score
 - Encouraged to submit recertification documents up to 6 months prior to due date)





Veteran Owned Business Certifications

- Veteran Small Business Certification (VetCert) program for government contracts
 - Program Benefits
 - Efficiently compete for the program's set aside contracts (7% of all contracts annually)
 - ♦ Access to SBA tools to
 - Prepare for federal procurement
 - Connect with commercial supply chains
 - Meet local business community
 - Purchase surplus federal property
 - Access capital
 - Mitigate disaster damage
 - ◆ Ability to compete for contract in other qualifying programs
 - Program Qualifications
 - ♦ Be a small business according to the SBAs size standards
 - ♦ 51% owned and controlled by a US veteran
 - Register as a small business at SAM.gov (System for Award Management)
 - Certification Application
 - ♦ Visit the <u>Veteran Small Business Certification portal</u> to create a MySBA account
 - ♦ Gather appropriate documentation
 - ♦ Complete the application
 - ♦ Two certification options
 - Veteran Owned Small Business Certification (VOSB)
 - Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business Certification (SDVOSB)
 - Requires a service-connected disability to qualify
 - Maintaining Certification
 - ♦ Certified prior to January 2023
 - CVE certification was granted through the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)
 - Granted automatic VOSB or SDVOSB certification under the SBA
 - > Granted an automatic 1 year extension to their certification
 - ♦ Certified after January 2023
 - Certification of VOSB or SDVOSB expires after 3 years





- National Veteran-Owned Business Association (NaVOBA) program for private sector contracts
 - Program Benefits
 - ◆ Certification can be used to gain confidence of private sector contractors to know they are working with a certified veteran owned business
 - ♦ Program Qualifications
 - > 51% owned and managed by US veteran or service-disabled US veteran
 - No business size limitations
 - ♦ Certification Application
 - ➤ Visit NaVOBA website to begin the application process
 - Validate your veteran status through ID.Me
 - Pay non-refundable application fee based on company revenue
 - Complete the application
 - ♦ Maintaining Certification
 - Certification expires after two years and must be renewed

LGBT Business Enterprise Certification (LGBTBE)

- Program Benefits
 - Opportunity to compete for sourcing contracts with NGLCC partners
 - National recognition by top US corporations
 - Eligible to exhibit at the annual NGLCC International Business and Leadership Conference
 - Automatic inclusion in the NGLCC online database
 - Use of NGLCC Certified Business logo on marketing materials
 - Access to mentorships, trainings, and scholarships from NGLCC partners
 - Access to special discounts from LGBTQ+-owned and allied partners
- Program Requirements
 - 51% owned, operated, managed, and controlled by a person who identifies as part of the LGBT community
 - Operate in the US
 - Independent from any non-LGBTQ+ business enterprise
- Certification Application
 - Visit the National LGBT Chamber of Commerce (NGLCC) website
 - Create a business profile on my.NGLCC.org
 - Submit supporting documents with assistance from a NGLCC team member
 - Complete a site visit
 - Pay application fee (waived if applicant provides proof of local chamber of commerce membership)
- Maintaining Certification
 - Certification expires after 3 years or if business structure changes
 - Complete a recertification application
 - Submit tax documents and fee or proof of chamber of commerce membership





Small Disadvantaged Business Certification (SDB)

- Program Benefits
 - Opportunity to compete for federal prime contracts/subcontracts
 - Self-representation certification, no application process
- Program Requirements
 - Be a small business according to SBA size standards
 - 51% owned and controlled by one or more socially or economically disadvantaged individuals
 - Register as a SDB on SAM.gov (System for Award Management)
- Certification Application
 - No application is required for certification
 - · Self-representation in business profile on SAM.gov
- Maintaining Certification
 - No expiration date or renewal required unless business no longer meets requirements

Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design Certification (LEED)

- Program Benefits
 - Gain trust of consumers and other businesses
- Program Requirements
 - Project certification rather than a business certification
 - Certification for brick-and-mortar businesses looking to go green
 - Certifications available for
 - ♦ Building Design and Construction
 - ♦ Interior Design and Construction
 - ♦ Building Operations and Maintenance
 - ♦ Neighborhood Development
 - ♦ Homes
 - ♦ Cities
 - Point system based on five performance categories
 - ♦ Energy
 - ♦ Water
 - **♦** Transportation
 - ♦ Waste
 - ♦ Human Experience
 - Certification levels based on accrued points
 - ♦ Certified (40-49 points)
 - ♦ Silver (50-59 points)
 - ♦ Gold (60-79 points)
 - ♦ Platinum (80+ points)





- Certification Application
 - Visit <u>U.S. Green Business Council (USGBC)</u> website
 - Register your project and pay appropriate certification fees
- Maintaining Certification
 - Certification must be renewed every 3 years
 - Registration fee is waived for recertification
 - Use the recertification link in LEED Online profile
